MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT:

INNOVATION PLACES IMPLEMENTATION GRANT UPDATE

As I am writing this newsletter, the Innovation Places Planning Team is wrapping up the DRAFT version of the initial implementation application. While the final application is due by April 1, 2017, we have an early opportunity to get some valuable feedback in mid March. This will greatly improve our final application.



The theme that is emerging is that Meriden will be taking a phased approach to becoming known an Innovation Place.

Phase I, in years I-2, will be getting prepared for innovation and we will initiate projects like:

- Hiring a District Concierge
- Securing Space(s) for Flexible Training and Temporary Uses
- Establishing a CT Business Launch Pad
- Growing the Entrepreneurial Mind-Set Training for our Anchor Institutions
- Starting a Meriden Match Competition
- Enhancing Programs for Early Stage Entrepreneurs Initiating Collegiate Programs
- Continuing the Assessment and Continued Planning functions

In Phase 2 (years 2-3), we will begin to create a place to innovate and thus become known throughout Connecticut as being an interesting place with an entrepreneurial flavor to live in and site a business. In addition to all of the above, we expect to add an Entrepreneur-In-Residence person, start Pop-up Festival(s) and a Food Competition.

By Phase 3 (years 4+), we will become known as an Innovation Leader in central Connecticut. We will continue the work above and add a Stage II Accelerator Program and Competition and establish a permanent Innovation and Entrepreneurship Center.

This is very exciting work that will make our community truly transformational. We believe that a rising tide lifts all ships. With these newly developed resources and tools, we will then be able to provide our member's with the tools they need to propel their businesses into the future in their respective fields. If you have any questions, please give me a call and we'll get you connected.




