FIRST MILE LAST MILE STUDY RELEASED

In March, we introduced you to the First Mile / Last Mile Survey and we were pleased that representatives from Berlin, Meriden and Wallingford all participated on this important project...and now the final report has been released. Each community along the Hartford Rail line needs to understand how to make the entire trip as seamless as possible. This project recognizes that a complete trip includes getting to the originating train station, taking the train AND then getting from destination train station to the final destination. This planning will maximize the opportunity for employees, shoppers and other visitors to use the rail and to utilize our three evolving Transit Oriented Development districts as well. A special thanks goes to the South Central Regional Council of Governments, Chamber member Milone & MacBroom, Inc. and the Meriden Economic Development Office for this great work.





WALLINGFORD ADOPTS TOD PLAN FOR NEW RAIL STATION AREA



As each community is planning for the start of new rail service in 2018, the Wallingford Planning and Zoning Commission recently adopted a new Transit Oriented Development Plan for the

3/4 mile area surrounding the new train station. This study area extends up through Choate campus.

Specific recommendations include increased residential densities, mixed-use zoning, streetscape improvements for bikeability and walkability, and better ways to connect the rail development area with Wallingford Center.

This business friendly plan adds another tool in the toolbox of the town of Wallingford to attract private sector development.




