

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

Connecticut Department of Transportation - (CTDOT) announced that Connecticut has become the first state in New England to utilize automated horn systems, commonly known as wayside horns; installed in at-grade railroad crossings as part of



noise mitigation efforts along the CTrail Hartford Line corridor. 
