MESSAGE FROM THE PRESIDENT: IF ALL POLITICS IS LOCAL...



We do get involved in political activities at this Chamber...but it's not exactly lobbying. We don't choose parties and we advocate for the causes of all businesses. Fundamentally, we want to be sure that our members have the access to and information about their elected and appointed officials. Knowing them, before you actually need them, is the essence

of our Leadership Pillar. Here are a few of our upcoming 'political" activities...

- * At our January 12, 2016 meeting of the Government and Business Development Committee, we are on schedule to finalize the 2016 Legislative Action Agenda. We anticipate that it will be approved by our Board of Directors on January 13th. We will then distribute the approved document to our entire membership via email and we will also provide electronic and paper copies to our legislators. It's a great document to start a conversation with our elected leaders.
- If you want to meet "one on one" with our State Elected Officials, we are hosting and AT&T is sponsoring our annual Legislative Breakfast on January 29, 2016 at the Villa Capri in Wallingford. This program is co-presented with our friends of Wallingford HUBCAP and the Cheshire Chamber of Commerce.

As we generally get a dozen or so legislators at this event, we provide a list of Senators and Representatives who are in attendance AND the committees that they currently work on. The format is one legislator per table and chamber members are free to walk around the room to connect with all legislators who may be working on your issues. Later in the program, we will propose some questions to all of the legislators about more general business concerns.

* Since the recent local elections, I have started meeting with our newly elected city council members. These are informal conversations to let each of them know what a Chamber of Commerce is and how we can all best work together. In addition, all council members are included on our mailing list and receive the Chamber Newsletter and other invitations to Chamber sponsored events and activities. We all look forward to meeting with our new council members at upcoming chamber events.


